Walking Tour with Jean-Philip Mathieu

This historical walking tour will explore the McGill area in the context of the creation, development, and death of the Golden Square Mile, Canada's richest neighborhood from the mid-nineteenth to the mid-twentieth century. It begins at the McGill Arts Building, goes up to the towering mansion Ravenscrag, and then back down the mountain ending at Roddick Gates. Jean-Philip Mathieu, who recently wrote about [British connections in Montreal](#), will lead the tour. The tour will last about 1 ¼ hours and take place rain-or-shine so please come prepared. Registration will be capped at 25 participants.

Guided Tour of the Pointe-à-Callière Museum
